- ★ The Sword Fish on the wall belonged to a good customer from Roanoke, Texas.
- ★ The hanging schoolhouse lights came from the now closed Pontchartrain Restaurant.
- We also have several Pontchartrain tables and some of their exterior doors.
- The tables and chairs have all come from other Restaurants and homes.
- ★ The cashier's light and the porch lights as well as the restroom and hours sign came from the Stonewall Jackson Elementary on Mockingbird Lane in Dallas; built in the 193O's.
- ♣ The "Bull" horns are from the African Watusi. These particular horns were mounted over 75 years ago near Fredericksburg, Texas.
- ♣ Bluebonnets aren't the only Texas blooms that put on a sensational show. Garland is famous for its signature "firewheel" – a wildflower that flourishes across the area in spring and summer.
- Our Honey is TEXAS BRUSH HONEY made from bees visiting Catclaw, Mesquite, White Brush, Huajillo and Persimmon. This should be good for local folk's allergies.
- ♣ A dessert of homemade biscuits with butter, honey and sorghum comes with your meal. This is a typical country dessert we grew up eating. SORGHUM (the jar on the table that isn't honey). Sorghum does not have the strong bitter taste of Molasses.
